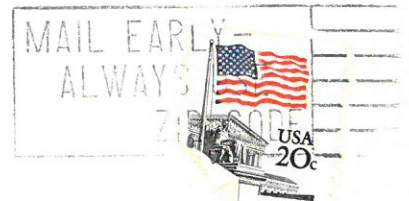

HOW TO COMMUNICATE SUCCESSFULLY ON YOUR JOB

Communication is one of the most important skills for a successful career. It is important for you to *convince* your supervisor to approve what you want; to persuade your colleagues to cooperate with you wholeheartedly and to get the confidence of those who work for you to do diligently what you want them to do. For a research and development scientist, it is also important to have skills in scientific communication. You must be able to sell your ideas, proposals and accomplishments to your peers and sponsors of your projects.

Communication can be either verbal or in writing. Verbally, communications can be done in private conversations and discussions in small groups or in relatively large meetings. In writing, communications can take various forms such as letters, memorandums, reports, publications, proposals and requests.

In order to communicate efficiently, the following steps should be considered:

1. To organize your thoughts so that they may be presented in a most logical manner.
2. To design ways of presentation with diagrams and figures so that the presentation is easily understandable, but has a strong impact. Most important of all, the presentation must be prepared so that it can be done within the time allocated to you and not boring.
3. To acquire sufficient knowledge in English and vocabulary to get your points across.
4. To be prepared to answer all possible questions and to defend yourself without hurting the feelings of others.

SUCCESSFUL CAREER MADE EASY

There are many Chinese professionals working in the food industry, but only a few of these have made it to the managerial rank when compared to the Americans. There are at least two reasons for this phenomena. One, most of the Chinese professionals were born and raised in an environment which is very different from, if not contradictory to, the United States. Often the behavior of many Chinese professionals is misunderstood and ill-received. The inability to recognize and overcome the cultural barriers is the most common obstacle to a successful career among the Chinese professionals. Two, there are always unwritten rules in an organization. These rules need to be understood and obeyed before a person can advance rapidly within the system. Unfortunately, most Chinese professionals are not aware of these facts and, consequently, have left their careers in the hand of supervisors rather than pursuing their own career advancement with a more earnest effort and positive attitude.

The speaker will address the most common cultural problems among Chinese professionals and will offer a systematic approach for overcoming these cultural handicaps. The sequence of events of how promotion occurs will be presented and analyzed. The speaker will discuss how to establish healthy relationships with your boss, your mentor, your sponsors, and your peers. Many case studies will be used for illustration purposes.

Here is a comment written by one of our members. I would like to share it with you.

"I happened to notice an embarrassing situation concerning some of our "active" members' attitude toward paying their membership dues on time. According to the Treasurer's report, as of March 1983, there are still many members whose names are associated with various committees but were not shown on the membership paid list. This reflects the fact that we have some members who express willingness to help the committee work but do not care about whether they have paid their dues or not. (If you will allow me to go through the list, I see Angel Yang, Daniel Fung, Chifa Lin, Sheree Lin, Ernest Chen, Chi-Hang Lee, Paul Lin, Kuang Chi Tang, Shaw Wang...etc. on this membership-still-unpaid list.) Is this a common dilemma we have to face in our organization? I hope that I am wrong, or something should be done to correct it.

"Furthermore, while we are doing a good job in soliciting donations from other companies, let's make sure that we, ourselves, fulfill our own obligation in paying our membership dues. Follow up the collection!"
