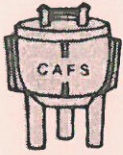

Dear Colleagues:

This letter is prepared to inform you some of our recent activities, and to remind you about what you need to do before the end of my presidency.

There was a CAFS officers gathering in Chicago on March 25 and 26. Those attended were Cathy Ang, George Chu, Y. C. Jao, Shu-Chi Lee, Peter Wan, and Grace Yao. Subjects discussed were very broad and most of them are covered in the 1987/88 annual objectives as shown in the CAFS Operational Committees program. Some issues will be further discussed in our annual executive meeting which has been scheduled at 17:30 - 19:00 on June 19 at Imperial Palace Regency, a Chinese restaurant on the ground level of Hyatt Regency hotel in New Orleans. The status of our operational committee program has been a mixed one. For example, Cathy/Peter/Santa's By-law program: It is suggested to use English version as the By-law for the society since our base is in the United States.
