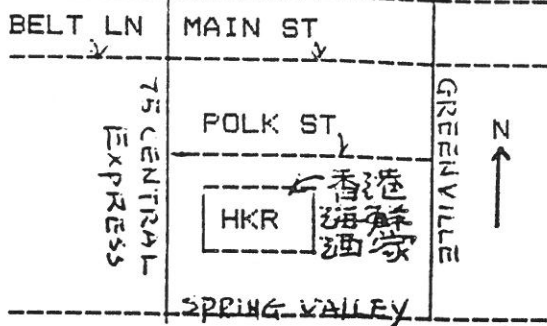

Members of the Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) met twice during the past several months. The following issues were discussed:

1. Proposing that CAFS to identify members with potentially stable addresses and computer processing capabilities to be in charge of updating the Directory and mailing of the Directory and newsletter (This can be the same person as Secretary or different. May we call this person: Directory Editor?). Thus, the Newsletter Editor would have more time to solicit articles and to edit the newsletters, etc. Then the master copy of newsletter will be sent to the Directory Editor for printing and mailing.
2. Proposing the CAFS to develop a strategy for identifying members with interest and enthusiasm to serve CAFS in any capacities. 食品科技工業升級 海外覓求專業人才

／崇仁

食品科技，目前正由農委會、經
濟部、國科會、衛生署、食品工業研究
所、生技中心、國科會及各大學分工合
作發展之中，農委會指出，目前國內食
品科技界最缺乏的是具有在食品企業技
術開發實際經驗的高級人才以及食品工
程方面專門人才。

目前國內共有七所大學與獨立學院及
五所專科學校設有食品方面的科系，共
有專任師資約一百五十人；財團法人食
品工業發展研究所與中華食品工業
技術研究所合計擁有研究人員約一百廿
人；民間食品企業投入研究發展的人力
，包括檢驗員、管人員，估計也有二百
五十人左右，綜合計算，有關之在職科
技人員當在五百人以上。

另一方面，每年自各級學校出來受過食
品科技專門訓練的人才，大概說來約有
博士十人，碩士七十人，學士二百廿人
，也很難兼具兩者之長。補救之道，除
了加強延攬化工與機械人才加入食品科
技研究行列以外，農委會等食品科技行
政單位亦鼓勵食品科系出身的有志人員
，儘量增補化工與機械學科的專門知識
，以從事這一方面的深入研究。

此外，具有在食品企業技術開發實際
經驗的高級人才，國內仍嫌不足。目前
農委會所屬的食品會報，已聘請旅美食
品科學專家十三人，在美國成立「
食品工業研究發展顧問委員會」，由張
聖祥博士擔任召集人，五年來，共有三
百餘位海外食品科技人才自動登記顯為
國內食品工業的發展盡力；兩年來應邀
回國舉辦各種研討講習或個別指導技術
改進的食料專家，一年也常達廿餘人。
因此海外人士的密切聯繫和有效運用，
已是我國加速發展食品科技的一個重要
憑藉。

而國內食品科技的發展，亦不再是以
維持擴大食品加工品外銷為目標，依據
國科會等各單位的研習，未來十年內食
品科技的中長程目標涵蓋六大範圍包
括：現有技術之改良與擴大應用、新技
術開發與有效應用、高品質新產品的
近程開發、食品安全衛生之研究、食品
營養與健康關係之研究、現代生物技術在
食品工業上之應用研究。

在這一六範圍之中，又列有廿八項重
要研究主題，其中十三項列為第一優先
，另十五項列為二優先。

第一優先者包括：冷凍凍結食品加工技
術、水產加工技術及機械研製、傳統食
品加工包裝技術及機械改良、無菌加工
包裝技術、食品包裝技術設備更新、
光電選別及自動稱重充填技術、米穀理
糧加工新產品、加工製藥物之經濟利用
、微生物所致食物中毒的研究、快速可
靠的食品微生物檢驗方法的發展、食品
工廠良好作業規範的訂立、徹底澄清各
種食品成分的功能及其許多慢性疾病之
間的關係、研究食品及其成分的生理影
響。

第二優先者包括：加工原料收獲後處
理及保鮮技術、肉品加工技術、果蔬加
工技術、油脂加工技術、擠壓及重組技
術、食品放射線照射技術、食品配料及
添加物開發、特殊保健食品的開發、食
品保存技術的擴大研究、發展營養確
的分析方法與儀器，以供精密測定食品
營養成分含量與生物有效性、最適營養
需要量的研究、食品中增補營養的研究
、食品工業用酵素之開發與生產研究、
食品工業用微生物菌株改良研究、微生
物方法生產食品添加物之研究。
